Westport Island Stakeholder Survey for Causeway Adaptation to Sea Level Rise

The Town of Westport Island was awarded a grant to assess the current causeways over Squam Creek on West Shore Road and Post Office Road, and over Heal Pond on West Shore Road, in light of expected sea level rise and enhanced storm surges in the years ahead thru 2100. We saw first-hand the damage that could be done during the recent January 10th and 13th storm events this year! Resident safety and well-being is a top priority as we plan for the future.

It is expected that each of the causeways will need to be redesigned and rebuilt to adapt for the expected conditions and to increase resiliency to the changed environment over the next 75 years; the expected lifetime of the needed upgrades. These changed conditions include a 4' sea level rise and a 4.3' storm surge based on Maine DOT guidance.

Wright-Pierce Environmental Engineering has been contracted to provide the Town with design options that both accommodate these expected conditions and increase resiliency and natural water flow into and out of the wetland ponds. Increasing water flow capability reduces the water pressure loads on the causeway structure and improves the health of the entrapped wetlands. Determining how much flow to accommodate and the degree of wetland restoration to be provided, are key considerations in the study.

As is any study, there are tradeoffs to consider, and those tradeoffs benefit from community inputs as well as economic considerations. Community considerations of recreation uses today, and added recreation options in the future, will be assessed, as will the ecological and resiliency enhancement benefits of wetland restoration. From an economic perspective, expected redesign and reconstruction costs are expected to approach \$5M. Much of that cost may be funded thru State and Federal grants. The degree of such funding will be governed, in part, by the degree of wetland restoration that results. Wetland restoration is a high priority for State and Federal grantors.
